<b>CASE MANAGEMENT AND MEDIATION ORDER</b>	

**THE FOLLOWING APPLIES TO THE BELOW MOTION – READ CAREFULLY:**

**The Parties shall participate by telephone in a SETTING CONFERENCE on May 31, 2023 at 10:00am by contacting Division 4 at (970) 257-8780 to SET a hearing on Temporary Orders**

**\*\* If you do not call at that time and you filed the Motion, the motion will be deemed abandoned and DENIED \*\***

1. The hearing will address only issues noted in the motion, or response to the motion.
  - a. If either party has filed any additional motion(s) prior to the hearing, said motion(s) will not be addressed at *this* hearing.
2. The hearing may not be continued or vacated by telephone call to the court.
  - a. Motions to continue must be in writing with the court allowing 21 days, as required, for a response to be filed.
  - b. If there is not enough time for the other party to respond, the parties must appear at the hearing.
3. If the moving party is represented by an attorney, said attorney shall make a good faith effort to schedule a Pretrial Conference with the unrepresented party to be held at least **10 days** prior to the hearing for the purpose of identifying undisputed facts, stipulations, witnesses, exhibits, position statements, parenting plans and unique legal issues to be addressed at the hearing.
4. Not less than **7 days** before the hearing, the attorney for the moving party shall file a Joint Trial Management Certificate (“JTMC”) with the Court setting out the undisputed facts, stipulations, witness and exhibit lists, position statements and unique legal issues to be addressed at the hearing. Sworn Financial Statements shall be filed with the JTMC if child support and/or maintenance is being requested as well as proposed Parenting Plans if parenting time and decision-making is being requested.
5. Temporary Orders hearings are frequently set on a trailing docket in which more than one case is set for the same time. Priority of the cases is at the discretion of the judicial officer with consideration of the following (this list is not exclusive):
  - a. Cases with children
  - b. Where mediation has been completed
  - c. Age of the temporary orders motion
  - d. Whether there are temporary orders in place
  - e. Whether this case has been re-set in the past
6. Not less than **14 days** before the hearing, you must send the other party a list of the people you intend to call as witnesses and copies of all exhibits you intend to introduce into evidence at the hearing. You must disclose the witness(es) full name(s), address(es), phone number(s) and a brief statement about what he/she will testify about.

**\*\*This provision is not required for any party only intending to call the parties as witnesses. If the list is not given within the required time frame, the witness may not be allowed to testify at the hearing\*\***

- i. Attorneys must also e-file the exhibits within this time
- ii. Pro Se Parties must file their exhibits in the clerk's office within this time frame

**\*\*If the exhibits are not exchanged within the required time frame, the exhibits may not be allowed to be used at the hearing\*\***

7. *Both* Parties shall file a position statement not to exceed **3 pages, 7 days** prior to the hearing. This may but need not be filed as part of the trial management certificate. The Parties will not be permitted to raise issues not raised in the position statement. The position statement will state briefly what is being requested, any agreements and any unusual statutory or case law references. This statement may be used instead of an opening Statement, unless good cause is shown
8. If hearing involves the Allocation and/or Modification of Parental Responsibilities, then each party shall file a proposed Parenting Plan
9. The parties owe each other and the court a duty of full and honest disclosure of all facts that materially affect their rights and interests and those of the children involved in the case. The parties are therefore **required**, within 21 days from the date of this order, to affirmatively provide the financial and witness disclosures required by C.R.C.P. 16.2 without a prior request from the other party. (**Note: financial disclosures are only required if the hearing addresses issues involving child support and/or maintenance**). The parties shall file a Certificate of Mailing with the court showing compliance with this order. Any expert witness disclosure shall comply with the requirements of C.R.C.P. 26(2). You may find Rules 16.2 and 26 in the Colorado Revised Statutes or at [www.courts.state.co.us](http://www.courts.state.co.us).
10. Parties and/or their attorneys wishing to appear via telephone or Webex for the hearing must file a motion with the Court **at least 7 days** before the hearing asking for permission to appear via telephone or Webex. If the parties wish to have any witness appear via telephone or WebEx, they must file a motion as soon as practicable after the need for absentee testimony becomes known but no later than **5 days** before the hearing seeking the Court's permission to do so. The motion must meet the requirements of Rule of Civil Procedure 43. You may find Rule 43 in the Colorado Revised Statutes or at [www.courts.state.co.us](http://www.courts.state.co.us). Failure to comply with this order may result in the party, attorney, or witness(es) not being allowed to appear remotely.
11. The Court May Limit the time for the hearing.
12. Any party representing him or herself are required to follow the rules of evidence and the laws of Colorado. All parties must proceed in a manner evidencing respect for the court and the other party.
13. **FAILURE TO BE PRESENT MAY CAUSE ORDERS TO BE ENTERED WITHOUT YOUR INPUT. IF THE MOVING PARTY FAILS TO APPEAR, THE MOTION WILL BE DEEMED ABANDONED AND DENIED.**
14. If you have a stipulation that resolves all pending issues, it **must be signed by all parties**, and submitted to the Court **with** a Motion asking the Court to adopt the Stipulation and vacate the hearing before the Court will vacate any pending hearing. Child support agreements must include Sworn Financial Statements (if they have not already been filed) and a child support worksheet. If you file a stipulation, you must call the Division Clerk to confirm that your hearing date has been vacated. In the alternative, the parties may appear at the hearing time and put the entire stipulation on the record.



## MEDIATION ORDER

Pursuant to the Dispute Resolution Act, 13-22-301, et seq., and to encourage compliance with 14-10-104.5, C.R.S., the parties **shall** schedule mediation or request relief from this mediation order prior to any contested hearing before the court. It is further ordered that the parties attend all scheduled mediation sessions and engage in good faith mediation until **successfully concluded or until the mediator determines that further efforts at mediation would be futile**. The parties are to agree upon a mediator, and if agreement cannot be made, both parties shall submit the name of a proposed mediator to the Court for the Court to make the final determination. The Parties must select a trained mediator using one of the following alternatives:

1. Contact the Office of Dispute Resolution (ODR) at [odrmediations@judicial.state.co.us](mailto:odrmediations@judicial.state.co.us) or **if you do not have access to a computer, call 720-625-5940, toll free 800-888-0001 Ext. 55940 for a mediator referral**. ODR contracts with local independent contract mediators. Information may be found on ODR's website at [www.coloradoODR.org](http://www.coloradoODR.org). For domestic relations cases, you may qualify for reduced fee mediation services. To qualify for reduced fee mediation services through ODR, please fill out Form JDF211 which may be found on ODR's website. The applicant must fill out the form completely. Incomplete forms are not processed. If you do not have computer access, this form can be obtained by calling 720-625-5940. Alternatively, if the Court allowed you to pursue your domestic relations case without having to pay a filing or response fee within the last 6 months, please take a copy of the court order waiving filing fees with you when you attend mediation with an ODR contract mediator: or
2. Contact a mediator from the list of mediators which can be found at [www.courts.state.co.us](http://www.courts.state.co.us). The list includes information regarding each mediator such as fee schedule, hours and experience. If you do not have access to a computer you may obtain a list at the Mesa County Justice Center, 125 N. Spruce St. or you may have a list mailed to you by contacting the Administrative Specialist at 970-257-3680.
3. Contact a mediator of your choice to schedule an appointment.

Costs of mediation shall be divided equally between the parties unless agreed otherwise. A certificate indicating compliance with this order must be filed by the parties or their counsel not less than seven days before the hearing. If not done, sanctions can be imposed which can include the hearing date being vacated by the court, or the non-complying party could be prevented from presenting evidence at the hearing.

A party may request in writing that the court exempt them from the mediation requirement based on a claim that he or she has been the victim of physical or psychological abuse or that there are compelling reasons to not require mediation.

**TO: BOTH PARTIES:**

**Pursuant to C.R.C.P. 16.2(e), you are hereby ordered to provide the following Mandatory Disclosures/Documents and completed Sworn Financial Statement to each other within 42 days after service a petition or a post decree motion upon you. Except for your respective Sworn Financial Statements which must be filed with the court, the other documents listed below are not to be filed with the court.**

**Notice: Failure to comply with this order may result in the failing party being precluded from calling any witnesses to testify regarding financial matters or introducing any documents relating to financial matters that the party has not disclosed pursuant to this order.**

**Mandatory Disclosures.** (Complete and accurate copies may replace originals. Children refers to minor children of both parties.)

(a) **Financial Statement.** Each party shall provide a complete and signed Sworn Financial Statement and (if applicable) Supplemental Schedule (JDF 1111 and/or JDF 1111SS) in the Supreme Court approved forms. Attached hereto is a copy of the Sworn Financial Statement for you to complete.

(b) **Income Tax Returns (Most Recent 3 Years).** Provide the personal and business federal income tax returns for the three years before filing of the petition or post decree motion. The business returns shall be for any business for which a party has an interest entitling the party to a copy of such returns. Provide all schedules and attachments including W-2's, 1099's and K-1. If a return is not completed at the time of disclosure, provide the documents necessary to prepare the return including W-2's, 1099's and K-1's, copies of extension requests and estimated tax payments.

(c) **Personal Financial Statements (Last 3 Years).** Provide all personal financial statements, statements of assets or liabilities, and credit and loan applications prepared during the last three years.

(d) **Business Financial Statements (Last 3 Years).** For every business for which a party has access to financial statements, provide the last three fiscal years' financial statements, all year-to-date financial statements, and the same periodic financial statements for the prior year.

(e) **Real Estate Documents.** Provide the title documents and all documents stating value of all real property in which a party has a personal or business interest.

(f) **Personal Debt.** Provide all documents creating debt, and the most recent debt statements showing the balance and payment terms.

(g) **Investments.** Provide most recent documents identifying each investment and stating the current value.

(h) Employment Benefits. Provide most recent documents identifying each employment benefit and stating the current value.

(i) Retirement Plans. Provide most recent documents identifying each retirement plan, and stating the current value, and all Plan Summary Descriptions.

(j) Bank/Financial Institution Accounts. Provide most recent documents identifying each account at banks and other financial institutions and stating the current value.

(k) Income Documentation. For each income source in the current and prior calendar year, including income from employment, investment, government programs, gifts, trust distributions, prizes, and income from every other source, provide pay stubs, a current income statement and the final income statement for the prior year. Each self-employed party shall provide a sworn statement of gross income, business expenses necessary to produce income and net income for the three months before filing of the petition or post decree motion.

(l) Employment and Education-Related Child Care Documentation. Provide documents that show average monthly employment-related child-care expense and/or child-care expenses related to parents' education and job search.

(m) Insurance Documentation. Provide life, health and property insurance policies and current documents that show beneficiaries, coverage, cost including the portion payable to provide health insurance for children, and payment schedule.

(n) Extraordinary Children's Expense Documentation. Provide documents that show average monthly expense for all recurring extraordinary children's expenses.

**Notice: After you have provided copies of the Mandatory Disclosures/Documents to the other party, you must file with the Court a Certificate of Compliance With Mandatory Financial Disclosures checking which documents you provided and/or explaining why you did not provide any unchecked documents. 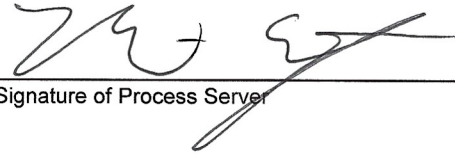

14-10-114. Spousal **maintenance** - advisory guidelines - legislative declaration -  
definitions

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(1) Legislative declaration.

(a) The general assembly hereby finds that:

(I) The economic lives of spouses are frequently closely intertwined in marriage and that it is often impossible to later segregate the respective decisions and contributions of the spouses; and

(II) Consequently, awarding spousal **maintenance** may be appropriate if a spouse needs support and the other spouse has the ability to pay support.

(b) The general assembly further finds that:

(I) Because the statutes provide little guidance to the court concerning **maintenance** awards, there has been inconsistency in the amount and term of **maintenance** awarded in different judicial districts across the state in cases that involve similar factual circumstances; and

(II) Courts and litigants would benefit from the establishment of a more detailed statutory framework that includes advisory guidelines to be considered as a starting point for the determination of fair and equitable **maintenance** awards.

(c) Therefore, the general assembly declares that it is appropriate to create a statutory framework for the determination of **maintenance** awards, including advisory guidelines for the amount and term of **maintenance** in certain cases, that will assist the court and the parties in crafting **maintenance** awards that are fair, equitable, and more consistent across judicial districts and in their application to both parties.

(2) At the time of permanent orders in dissolution of marriage, legal separation, or declaration of invalidity proceedings, and upon the request of either party, the court may order the payment of **maintenance** from one spouse to the other pursuant to the provisions of this section. An award of **maintenance** shall be in an amount and for a term that is fair and equitable to both parties and shall be made without regard to marital misconduct.

(3)

(a)

(I) Determination of **maintenance**. When a party has requested **maintenance** in a dissolution of marriage, legal separation, or declaration of invalidity proceeding, prior to granting or denying an award of **maintenance**, the court shall make initial written or oral findings concerning:

(A) The amount of each party's gross income;

(B) The marital property apportioned to each party;

(C) The financial resources of each party, including but not limited to the actual or potential income from separate or marital property;

(D) Reasonable financial need as established during the marriage; and

(E) Whether **maintenance** awarded pursuant to this section would be deductible for federal income tax purposes by the payor and taxable income to the recipient.

(II) After making the initial findings described in subparagraph (I) of this paragraph (a), the court shall determine the amount and term of the **maintenance** award, if any, that is fair and equitable to both parties after considering:

(A) The guideline amount and term of **maintenance** set forth in paragraph (b) of this subsection (3), if applicable, based upon the duration of the marriage and the combined gross incomes of the parties;

(B) The factors relating to the amount and term of **maintenance** set forth in paragraph (c) of this subsection (3); and

(C) Whether the party seeking **maintenance** has met the requirement for a **maintenance** award pursuant to paragraph (d) of this subsection (3).

(b) Advisory guideline amount and term of **maintenance**. If the duration of the parties' marriage is at least three years and the parties' combined, annual adjusted gross income does not exceed two hundred forty thousand dollars, the court shall make additional oral or written findings concerning the duration of the marriage in whole months and the advisory guideline amount and term of **maintenance**, calculated as follows:

(I)

(A) If the **maintenance** award is deductible for federal income tax purposes by the payor and taxable income to the recipient, the amount of **maintenance** under the advisory guidelines is equal to forty percent of the parties' combined, monthly adjusted gross income minus the lower income party's monthly adjusted gross income. If the calculation results in a negative number, the amount of **maintenance** is zero.

(B) If the **maintenance** award is not deductible for federal income tax purposes by the payor and not taxable income to the recipient, the amount of **maintenance** under the advisory guidelines for parties with a combined, monthly adjusted gross income of ten thousand dollars or less is equal to eighty percent of the amount calculated pursuant to subsection (3)(b)(I)(A) of this section.

(C) If the **maintenance** award is not deductible for federal income tax purposes by the payor spouse and not taxable income to the recipient spouse, the amount of **maintenance** under the advisory guidelines for parties with a combined, monthly adjusted gross income of more than ten thousand dollars but not more than twenty thousand dollars is equal to seventy-five percent of the amount calculated pursuant to subsection (3)(b)(I)(A) of this section.

(II)

(A) The advisory term of **maintenance** under the guidelines, calculated in whole months, for marriages of at least three years but not more than twenty years, is set forth in the table contained in subsection (3)(b)(II)(B) of this section. When the duration of the parties' marriage exceeds twenty years, the court may award **maintenance** for a specified term of years or for an indefinite term, but the court shall not specify a **maintenance** term that is less than the **maintenance** term under the guidelines for a twenty-year marriage without making specific findings that support a reduced term of **maintenance**.

(c) Factors affecting the amount and term of **maintenance**. In any proceeding for **maintenance**, the court shall consider all relevant factors, including but not limited to:

(I) The financial resources of the recipient spouse, including the actual or potential income from separate or marital property or any other source and the ability of the recipient spouse to meet his or her needs independently;

(II) The financial resources of the payor spouse, including the actual or potential income from separate or marital property or any other source and the ability of the payor spouse to meet his or her reasonable needs while paying **maintenance**;

(III) The lifestyle during the marriage;

(IV) The distribution of marital property, including whether additional marital property may be awarded to reduce or alleviate the need for **maintenance**;

(V) Both parties' income, employment, and employability, obtainable through reasonable diligence and additional training or education, if necessary, and any necessary reduction in employment due to the needs of an unemancipated child of the marriage or the circumstances of the parties;

(VI) Whether one party has historically earned higher or lower income than the income reflected at the time of permanent orders and the duration and consistency of income from overtime or secondary employment;

(VII) The duration of the marriage;

(VIII) The amount of temporary **maintenance** and the number of months that temporary **maintenance** was paid to the recipient spouse;

(IX) The age and health of the parties, including consideration of significant health care needs or uninsured or unreimbursed health care expenses;

(X) Significant economic or noneconomic contribution to the marriage or to the economic, educational, or occupational advancement of a party, including but not limited to completing an education or job training, payment by one spouse of the other spouse's separate debts, or enhancement of the other spouse's personal or real property;

(XI) Whether the circumstances of the parties at the time of permanent orders warrant the award of a nominal amount of **maintenance** in order to preserve a claim of **maintenance** in the future;

(XII) Whether the **maintenance** is deductible for federal income tax purposes by the payor and taxable income to the recipient, and any adjustments to the amount of **maintenance** to equitably allocate the tax burden between the parties; and

(XIII) Any other factor that the court deems relevant.

(d) After considering the provisions of this section and making the required findings of fact, the court shall award **maintenance** only if it finds that the spouse seeking **maintenance** lacks sufficient property, including marital property apportioned to him or her, to provide for his or her reasonable needs and is unable to support himself or herself through appropriate employment or is the custodian of a child whose condition or circumstances make it inappropriate for the spouse to be required to seek employment outside the home.

(e) The **maintenance** guidelines set forth in paragraph (b) of this subsection (3) do not create a presumptive amount or term of **maintenance**. The court has discretion to determine the award of **maintenance** that is fair and equitable to both parties based upon the totality of the circumstances. The court shall make specific written or oral findings in support of the amount and term of **maintenance** awarded pursuant to this section or an order denying **maintenance**.



(f) The court may award additional marital property to the recipient spouse or otherwise adjust the distribution of marital property or debt to alleviate the need for **maintenance** or to reduce the amount or term of **maintenance** awarded.

(g) The court may reserve jurisdiction to establish, review, or modify an award of **maintenance** at a later date pursuant to the provisions of this section by setting forth:

(I) The reasons for reserving jurisdiction;

(II) The ascertainable future event that forms the basis for reserving jurisdiction; and

(III) A reasonably specific time within which **maintenance** may be considered pursuant to this section.

(h) The court may award **maintenance** in short-term marriages, including marriages of less than three years in duration, when, given the circumstances of the parties, the distribution of marital property is insufficient to achieve an equitable result. In determining the award of **maintenance**, the court may consider the **maintenance** guidelines and the relevant factors affecting the amount and term of **maintenance** set forth in this subsection (3). The court shall make written or oral findings pursuant to paragraph (e) of this subsection (3).

(i) Nothing in this section prohibits an award of **maintenance** in gross.

(3.5) Combined annual adjusted gross income in excess of advisory guideline amount. If the parties' combined, annual adjusted gross income exceeds two hundred forty thousand dollars, the calculation methodology described in subsection (3)(b)(I) of this section for determining the advisory guideline amount of **maintenance** does not apply, and the court shall instead consider the factors set forth in subsection (3)(c) of this section in determining the amount of **maintenance**. The court may consider the advisory guideline term of **maintenance** set forth in subsection (3)(b)(II) of this section.

(4) Temporary **maintenance**. (a) (I) In every proceeding for dissolution of marriage, legal separation, or declaration of invalidity where temporary **maintenance** is requested by a party, the court may award a monthly amount of temporary **maintenance** pursuant to the provisions of subsection (3) of this section that are relevant to a determination of temporary **maintenance**.

(II) The guideline term of **maintenance** set forth in subparagraph (II) of paragraph (b) of subsection (3) of this section does not apply to temporary **maintenance** orders. The court shall determine the term for payment of temporary **maintenance**.

(III) In addition to the relevant factors set forth in paragraph (c) of subsection (3) of this section, the court shall consider any additional factors specific to the determination of temporary **maintenance**, including the payment of family expenses and debts.

(b) After determining the amount of temporary **maintenance** pursuant to this subsection (4) and the amount of temporary child support pursuant to section 14-10-115, the court shall consider the respective financial resources of each party and determine the temporary payment of marital debt and the temporary allocation of marital property.

(c) A determination of temporary **maintenance** does not prejudice the rights of either party at permanent orders.

(5) Modification or termination of **maintenance**. (a) Except upon written agreement of the parties, an award of **maintenance** entered pursuant to this section may be modified or terminated pursuant to the provisions of section 14-10-122. The court may consider the guideline amount and term of **maintenance** and the statutory factors set forth in subsection (3) of this section only in a modification or termination proceeding concerning a **maintenance** award entered on or after January 1, 2014.

(b) The enactment of this section does not constitute a substantial and continuing change of circumstance for purposes of modifying **maintenance** orders entered before January 1, 2014.

(c) The enactment of the December 2017 "Tax Cuts and Jobs Act", Pub.L. 115-97, federal tax legislation, does not constitute a substantial and continuing change of circumstance for purposes of modifying **maintenance** orders entered prior to the effective date of that law.

(6) **Security for the payment of maintenance.** (a) The court may require the payor spouse to provide reasonable security for the payment of **maintenance** in the event of the payor spouse's death prior to the end of the **maintenance** term.

(b) Reasonable security may include, but need not be limited to, **maintenance** of life insurance for the benefit of the recipient spouse. In entering an order to maintain life insurance, the court shall consider:

- (I) The age and insurability of the payor spouse;
- (II) The cost of the life insurance;
- (III) The amount and term of the **maintenance**;
- (IV) Whether the parties carried life insurance during the marriage;
- (V) Prevailing interest rates at the time of the order; and
- (VI) Other obligations of the payor spouse.

(c) Orders to maintain security may be modified or terminated pursuant to section 14-10-122.

(7) **Maintenance agreements - waiver - unrepresented parties.** (a) Either or both of the parties may agree in writing or orally in court to waive **maintenance** consistent with the provisions of section 14-10-112. The parties may also agree to waive **maintenance** in a premarital agreement or marital agreement consistent with the provisions of the "Uniform Premarital and Marital Agreements Act", created in part 3 of article 2 of this title. The enforceability of **maintenance** provisions in a premarital agreement or marital agreement is determined pursuant to the provisions of section 14-2-309.

(b) In any proceeding that falls within the **maintenance** guidelines set forth in subsection (3) of this section, at the time of either temporary orders or permanent orders, if either party is not represented by an attorney, the court shall not approve an agreement waiving **maintenance** or agreeing to an amount or term of **maintenance** that does not follow the **maintenance** guidelines unless the unrepresented party has indicated that he or she is aware of the **maintenance** guidelines pursuant to this section.

(8) **Definitions.** As used in this section, unless the context otherwise requires:

(a)

(I) "Adjusted gross income" means gross income as defined in subsection (8)(c) of this section, less preexisting court-ordered child support obligations actually paid by a party, preexisting court-ordered alimony or **maintenance** obligations actually paid by a party, as adjusted, if applicable, pursuant to subsection (8)(a)(III) of this section, and the adjustment to a party's income as determined pursuant to section 14-10-115 (6)(b) for any children who are not children of the marriage for whom the party has a legal responsibility to support.

(II) For purposes of this subsection (8)(a), "income" means the actual gross income of a party, if employed to full capacity, or potential income, if unemployed or underemployed.

(III)

(A) For purposes of this subsection (8)(a), if the preexisting court-ordered alimony or **maintenance** obligations actually paid by a party are deductible for federal income tax purposes by that party, then the full amount of alimony or **maintenance** actually paid must be deducted from that party's gross income.

(B) If the preexisting court-ordered alimony or **maintenance** obligations actually paid by a party are not deductible for federal income tax purposes by that party, then the amount of preexisting court-ordered alimony or **maintenance** that is deducted from that party's gross income is the amount actually paid by that party multiplied by

1.25.

(b) "Duration of marriage" means the number of whole months, beginning from the first day of the month following the date of the parties' marriage until the date of decree or the date of the hearing on disposition of property if such hearing precedes the date of the decree.

(c)

(l) "Gross income" means income from any source and includes, but is not limited to:

(A) Income from salaries;

(B) Wages, including tips declared by the individual for purposes of reporting to the federal Internal revenue service or tips imputed to bring the employee's gross earnings to the minimum wage for the number of hours worked, whichever is greater;

(C) Commissions;

(D) Payments received as an independent contractor for labor or services, which payments must be considered income from self-employment;

(E) Bonuses;

(F) Dividends;

(G) Severance pay;

(H) Pension payments and retirement benefits actually received that have not previously been divided as property in this action, including but not limited to those paid pursuant to articles 51, 54, 54.5, and 54.6 of title 24, C.R.S., and article 30 of title 31, C.R.S.;

(I) Royalties;

(J) Rents;

(K) Interest;

(L) Trust income and distributions;

(M) Annuity payments;

(N) Capital gains;

(O) Any moneys drawn by a self-employed individual for personal use that are deducted as a business expense, which moneys must be considered income from self-employment;

(P) Social security benefits, including social security benefits actually received by a party as a result of the disability of that party;

(Q) Workers' compensation benefits;

(R) Unemployment insurance benefits;

(S) Disability insurance benefits;

(T) Funds held in or payable from any health, accident, disability, or casualty insurance to the extent that such insurance replaces wages or provides income in lieu of wages;

(U) Monetary gifts;

(V) Monetary prizes, excluding lottery winnings not required by the rules of the Colorado lottery commission to be paid only at the lottery office;

(W) Income from general partnerships, limited partnerships, closely held corporations, or limited liability companies; except that, if a party is a passive investor, has a minority interest in the company, and does not have any managerial duties or input, then the income to be recognized may be limited to actual cash distributions received;

(X) Expense reimbursements or in-kind payments received by a party in the course of employment, self-employment, or operation of a business if they are significant and reduce personal living expenses;

(Y) Alimony or **maintenance** received pursuant to a preexisting court order with a payor who is not a party to the action, as adjusted, if applicable, pursuant to subsection (8)(c)(VI) of this section; and

(Z) Overtime pay, only if the overtime is required by the employer as a condition of employment.

(II) "Gross income" does not include:

(A) Child support payments received;

(B) Benefits received from means-tested public assistance programs, including but not limited to assistance provided under the Colorado works program, as described in part 7 of article 2 of title 26, C.R.S., supplemental security income, food stamps, and general assistance;

(C) Income from additional jobs that result in the employment of the obligor more than forty hours per week or more than what would otherwise be considered to be full-time employment;

(D) Social security benefits received by a parent on behalf of a minor child as a result of the death or disability of a parent or stepparent; and

(E) Earnings or gains on retirement accounts, including individual retirement accounts; except that such earnings or gains shall not be included as income unless a party takes a distribution from the account. If a party may take a distribution from the account without being subject to a federal tax penalty for early distribution and the party chooses not to take a distribution, the court may consider the distribution that could have been taken in determining the party's gross income.

(III)

(A) For income from self-employment, rent, royalties, proprietorship of a business, or joint ownership of a partnership or closely held corporation, "gross income" equals gross receipts minus ordinary and necessary expenses, as defined in sub-subparagraph (B) of this subparagraph (III), required to produce such income.

(B) "Ordinary and necessary expenses", as used in sub-subparagraph (A) of this subparagraph (III), does not include amounts allowable by the internal revenue service for the accelerated component of depreciation expenses or investment tax credits or any other business expenses determined by the court to be inappropriate for determining gross income for purposes of calculating **maintenance**.

(IV) If a party is voluntarily unemployed or underemployed, **maintenance** shall be calculated based on a determination of potential income; except that a determination of potential income shall not be made for a party who is physically or mentally incapacitated or is caring for a child under the age of thirty months for whom the parties owe a joint legal responsibility or for an incarcerated parent sentenced to one year or more.

(V) For the purposes of this section, a party shall not be deemed "underemployed" if:

(A) The employment is temporary and is reasonably intended to result in higher income within the foreseeable future; or

(B) The employment is a good faith career choice; or

(C) The party is enrolled in an educational program that is reasonably intended to result in a degree or certification within a reasonable period of time and that will result in a higher income, so long as the educational program is a good faith career choice.

(VI) For purposes of subsection (8)(c)(I)(Y) of this section, if alimony or **maintenance** received by a party pursuant to a preexisting court order is taxable income to that party for federal income tax purposes, then the actual amount of alimony or **maintenance** received is included in that party's gross income. If the alimony or **maintenance** received by a party pursuant to a preexisting court order is not taxable income to that party for federal income tax purposes, then the amount of alimony or **maintenance** that is included in that party's gross income is the amount of alimony or **maintenance** received multiplied by 1.25.

(9) Application. The provisions of this section apply only to actions in which a petition for dissolution of marriage, legal separation, or declaration of invalidity, or an action for the initial establishment of **maintenance** is filed on or after January 1, 2014. Actions filed before January 1, 2014, are determined pursuant to the provisions of this section as it existed at the time of the filing of the action.

**December 2015: Boebert Was Arrested For Failing To Appear In Court.** “The court was less accommodating that time, records indicate. On Dec. 1, 2015, Boebert was arrested by sheriff’s deputies for failure to appear, according to Colorado Bureau of Investigation arrest records.” [Denver Post, [8/27/20](#)]

**June 2015: Boebert Was Charged With A Class One Petty Offense After A Verbal Altercation With Law Enforcement.** “Congressional candidate Lauren Boebert of Rifle, who has defended ‘law and order’ and recently called for protesters to start ‘behaving’ in the wake of widespread demonstrations against police brutality, was detained and handcuffed herself after a verbal altercation with law enforcement at a 2015 country music festival, records show. A petty offense charge for disorderly conduct — which the Mesa County district attorney later dismissed — arose from an incident at the Country Jam music festival near Grand Junction, where sheriff’s deputies said Boebert encouraged people arrested for underage drinking to break free and repeatedly said she had ‘friends at Fox News’ who would report on her subsequent ‘illegal arrest,’ according to deputy accounts in a case report. [...] When Boebert didn’t stop yelling after being asked multiple times by law enforcement, two deputies ‘advised her she was under arrest for disorderly conduct’ and handcuffed her, according to the statement.” [Colorado Newsline, [8/13/20](#)]

**Boebert Was Given A Court Summons But Failed To Appear For Two Separate Hearings In The Case.** “Boebert was given a court summons and released but later failed to appear for two separate hearings in the case, court records show. The Mesa County district attorney’s office dismissed a class 1 petty offense charge against Boebert ‘in the interest of justice,’ writing that there was ‘no reasonable likelihood of conviction should (the) case go to trial.’ Under current Colorado law, a class 1 petty offense carries a maximum penalty of six months in jail, a \$500 fine or both.” [Colorado Newsline, [8/13/20](#)]

**September 2010: Boebert Was Arrested In An Animal Complaint Case.** On September 21, 2010, Lauren Boebert was listed as a suspect in an animal complaint case of two counts of “05-48 (8.1) Dog at Large” and one count of 05-48 (5) “Dog License – required.” The reporting party was Michele Soet. ## **COLORADO CRIMINAL HISTORY INFORMATION SHEET**

### **1. WHO IS CRIMINAL JUSTICE/LAW ENFORCEMENT?**

"Criminal justice agency" means any court with criminal jurisdiction and any agency of the state or of any county, city and county, town, boards of institutions of higher education, school district, special district, judicial district, or law enforcement authority which performs any activity directly relating to the detection or investigation of crime; the apprehension, pretrial release, posttrial release, prosecution, correctional supervision, rehabilitation, evaluation, or treatment of accused persons or criminal offenders; or criminal identification activities or the collection, storage, or dissemination of arrest and criminal records information.

### **2. DEFINE LAWFUL USE OF THE RECORDS.**

Records shall not be used by any person for the purpose of soliciting business for pecuniary gain. The official custodian shall deny any person access to records of official actions and criminal justice records unless such person signs a statement which affirms that such records shall not be used for the direct solicitation of business for pecuniary gain.

### **3. WHO ARE FINGERPRINT CARD CONTRIBUTORS?**

Fingerprint card contributors are "Criminal Justice Agencies," as defined above (#1).

### **4. WHAT IS A DISPOSITION?**

"Disposition" means a decision not to file criminal charges after arrest; the conclusion of criminal proceedings, including conviction, acquittal, or acquittal by reason of insanity; the dismissal, abandonment, or indefinite postponement of criminal proceedings; formal diversion from prosecution; sentencing, correctional supervision, and release from correctional supervision, including terms and conditions thereof; outcome of appellate review of criminal proceedings; or executive clemency.

### **5. WHERE CAN I GET A DISPOSITION IF IT IS NOT POSTED TO MY CBI RECORD?**

You can get copies of your dispositions from [www.cocourts.com](http://www.cocourts.com) for a nominal fee. These records are also available from the courts in which you appeared. If your case never went to court, you may be able to get the records from the arresting agency itself (the police department or sheriff's office) or the district attorney's office in the jurisdiction where you were arrested.

### **6. WHAT JUVENILE RECORDS ARE RELEASED TO THE PUBLIC?**

The records of law enforcement officers concerning juveniles, including identifying information, shall be identified as juvenile records and shall not be inspected by or disclosed to the public. The only Juvenile records released to the public are those juveniles that have been charged as adults. DUI and minor traffic violations are also releasable if the juvenile is over 16 years old when the offenses occur. Juvenile registered sex offender records will also be released.

### **7. WHAT IS A SEALED RECORD AND HOW CAN I GET MY RECORD SEALED?**

A sealed record is available only to law enforcement, not to the general public. Any person in interest (party to the case) may petition the District Court to seal records by filing a civil action in the county in which any arrest and/or criminal records are filed. A separate civil case must be filed for each court case record you want sealed, unless both a county court case (F Case) and a district court case (CR case) were established as a result of the same offense. You can obtain information on sealing your record from the State Judicial website, [www.courts.state.co.us](http://www.courts.state.co.us), or from the courts in which you appeared.

**8.WHO DO I CONTACT IF I HAVE A DISPUTE WITH MY RECORD?**

Any person in interest who is provided access to any criminal justice records shall have the right to challenge the accuracy and completeness of records to which he has been given access, insofar as they pertain to him, and to request that said records be corrected. You can do a record challenge at CBI (for information on this procedure go to the website, [www.cbi.state.co.us/id](http://www.cbi.state.co.us/id) or call (303) 239-4208. You can also take your dispute directly to the arresting agency.

**9.WHAT ARE COURT FILING ON DOCKET ENTRIES?**

These entries on the CBI record are displayed electronically on the Colorado criminal history by the State Judicial Department. They are currently posted from district court cases and they are based on the court case number, the arrest number, the last name of the individual, and the arresting agency.

**10. WHAT IS DOC INCARCERATION SENTENCE?**

DOC Incarceration Sentence is not a new arrest entry on the criminal history. When a person is convicted of a crime and they are sentenced to the Department of Corrections, an entry is made into the criminal history showing the charge the person was convicted of and how long the jail sentence was.

**11. WHAT SEX OFFENDER INFORMATION WILL BE RELEASED WITH THE RECORD?**

For additional sex offender information please access the Colorado Sex Offender website, [www.sor.state.co.us](http://www.sor.state.co.us). The results of the CBI record check will show if the person being checked on is currently a registered sex offender. Sex offender charges do not necessarily require a person to register as a sex offender.

**12. DOES CBI RELEASE WARRANT INFORMATION? WHAT IS A FUGITIVE OF OTHER JURISDICTION ENTRY?**

CBI does not release warrant information to the public. If you know what agency the warrant is out of, you will need to contact that agency for the information. That agency may or may not be able to release the warrant information; depending on their policy regarding the release of such information. The website, [www.cocourts.com](http://www.cocourts.com), may also provide some warrant information. A Fugitive of Other Jurisdiction charge means that the person in question had a warrant out of one law enforcement agency and was arrested by another agency for that warrant. The person does not necessarily have an active warrant out for their arrest.

## AFFIDAVIT FOR ARREST WARRANT

YOUR AFFIANT IS AN OFFICER FOR THE SILT POLICE DEPARTMENT, COLORADO WHOSE RESPONSIBILITIES INCLUDE THE INVESTIGATION OF CRIMINAL ACTIVITY IN THAT JURISDICTION. YOUR AFFIANT HAS PERSONAL KNOWLEDGE OF THE FACTS CONTAINED WITHIN THIS AFFIDAVIT THROUGH PERSONAL INVOLVMENT, INTERVIEWS WITH WITNESSES AND OTHER POLICE OFFICERS, AND THROUGH REVIEWING OFFICIAL POLICE REPORTS.:

My name is Officer Terran Farnham and I am employed as a Patrol Officer for the Silt Police Department (SPD), Town of Silt, State of Colorado, and have been employed as a Certified Peace Officer at all times relevant to this affidavit.

On 01/06/24 at approximately 1954 hours Officers were dispatched to The Miner's Claim Restaurant, located at 740 Main St, Silt, Garfield County, CO, 81652. Dispatch advised a male had called stating "Domestic Violence abuse." Before the call disconnected. A second party called and stated that her name was Lauren, dispatch advised they heard the female say "I just touched your nose." The male was heard saying "She punched me in the face."

On 01/08/24 I was made aware of this call. I was asked to help with the follow up investigation by Chief Kite and Lieutenant Gronbeck. I reviewed Ofc. Morrison's body worn camera and learned the following information.

Officer Morrison arrived on scene at approximately 1956 hours. At 1957 hours she contacts a female later identified as Lauren Boebert DOB: 12/19/86, in front of the restaurant on the sidewalk on Main Street. It should be noted that the front most part of the restaurant is a patio area with fire pits. The patio is raised approximately 2-3 feet off street level and surrounded by a guard rail.

Lauren asks Ofc. Morrison if they could move to a different area to speak. A male can be heard raising his voice in the background, Ofc. Morrison tells the male she will talk to him in a minute. The male yells at Ofc. Morrison "we'll see who's right and who's wrong." Ofc. Morrison turns to face the male, he is wearing a dark colored jacket, black cowboy hat and jeans. Ofc. Morrison give the male a lawful command to stay right where he was on the patio.

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Ofc. Morrison spoke with Lauren at her vehicle a white Audi SUV that was parked in the parking lot of 810 Main St.

Lauren explained she was having a conversation with her ex-husband, Jayson Boebert DOB: 12/6/80, and the topic turned to their new partners. Things got heated as both parties argued, at one point Lauren admitted to placing her finger on Jayson's nose to end the conversation. Jayson at that point picked up his phone and called 911, stating he wanted to report domestic abuse and hung up.

Lauren stated Jayson told her "Congratulations your name is going to be in the headline."

Ofc. Morrison asked Lauren how much Jayson has had to drink, Lauren replied Jayson had much more to drink than she had. Lauren stated that they each had a drink earlier in the night at their old residence before moving to The Miner's Claim to finish their conversation thinking it would be peaceful. Lauren explained they have been trying to reconcile and get on good terms.

Lauren explained to Ofc. Morrison that Jayson is hurt and she believes he is doing this tonight to make her suffer like he is after the divorce.

Lauren went on to say Jayson had drank three drinks of Tequila when she had arrived at their old residence. Lauren stated after they had their shared drinks things got tense and Jayson had come at her. Lauren said she had to push Jayson away and she told him "Don't touch me, like do not touch me." Ofc. Morrison asked Lauren if Jayson gets aggressive when he drinks and Lauren responded that he does. Lauren did state their 14-year-old son did witness the incident at the house.

Ofc. Morrison asked Lauren if there were any witnesses around that may have seen their argument at the restaurant. Ofc. Morrison explains she is waiting for a cover car to contact Jayson and she wants Lauren to stay at the scene, when a male can be heard yelling in the background. Ofc. Morrison turns around and gives the male another lawful command to sit down and stop. Ofc. Morrison collects Laurens's driver's license, Ofc. Morrison allows her to start her car but gives her a lawful order to not drive.

When a Corporal from Garfield County Sheriff's Office and New Castle Police Department arrives on scene Ofc. Morrison discuss the situation and make their way to the restaurant to contact Jayson. Ofc. Morrison notes that Jayson is no longer on the patio where she had told him to stay.

At approximately 2008 hours Ofc. Morrison enters the restaurant and turns to her immediate right the male wearing the cowboy hat and dark colored jacket has now moved inside and sat at another table. Reviewing the body camera, the restaurant appears to be full and is quite loud, servers and patrons can be seen walking past the Officers and Deputy as they attempt to contact Jayson.

Ofc. Morrison says Jayson and the male lifts his head. Ofc. Morrison asks the male to step outside and speak with her, Jayson states "No, I won't do it." Jayson stated "She punched me in the face I ain't doing anything. Jayson goes on to say that he had been punched in the face at the house and then had been punched in the face at the restaurant. It should be noted Ofc. Morrison

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notes in her report that Jayson appeared under the influence of alcohol and was drinking what appeared to be an alcoholic beverage while Ofc. Morrison was trying to speak with Jayson.

Jayson argues with Ofc. Morrison and the Garfield County Corporal saying he isn't going to talk to them. Jayson begins yelling at the Officers and the Deputy stating "Get the fuck out." At one point an unidentified female states she had witnessed Jayson getting struck in the face.

It should be noted the Silt Police Department is still investigating the claims of domestic abuse against Jayson Boebert.

Jayson continues to fail to cooperate with officers attempts to speak with him.

At 2018 hours Ofc. Morrison speaks with the manager of the restaurant, Kim Frees DOB: 07/08/76. Kim agrees with Ofc. Morrison that Jayson needs to leave from the restaurant. Kim asks Jayson to leave the restaurant. Kim goes to Jayson and tries to speak with him, Jayson continues to raise his voice and yell at officers.

Ofc. Morrison tells Jayson he needs to leave, Jayson states "I'm gonna drink some drinks before the fucker closes. I'm gonna get so fucking drunk, I don't even wanna talk to you mother fuckers." Jayson stated he would be so drunk it would take a couple days for him to sober up so officers could speak with him.

Ofc. Morrison tells Jayson again he needs to leave and that he would be escorted out of the bar at approximately 2021 hours. Jayson continues to yell and argue with Ofc. Morrison, yelling explicitly and stating "Shut the fuck up."

Ofc. Morrison tells Jayson he has been asked to leave and he needs to leave, Ofc. Morrison positioned her self on the left side of Jayson and attempted to assist him up. Jayson states "You touch me one more fucking time." Jayson continues to argue and yell at Officers and Deputies.

At approximately 2024 hours Jayson finally stands up after being asked to leave by Officers no less than 7 times. Jayson turns around and raises hands Deputies on scene grab his hands and turn him around and tell him to walk out the door.

On Ofc. Morrisons body camera you can observe Jayson grab the door frame with his left hands, Ofc. Morrison had to physically remove his hand from the door frame. When Ofc. Morrison was successful Jayson immediately turns around, Deputies then grab Jayson in control holds and escort him outside of the restaurant.

Outside the restaurant, Jayson continues arguing with Ofc. Morrison. Jayson's agitation continues to rise as he yells at Officers to investigate his ex-wife for DUI. Jayson tries to walk past Ofc. Morrison in the direction of Lauren's car. Ofc. Morrison gives Jayson a lawful command to stop. Jayson stops and turns around and continues yelling at Officers that "Y'all fucked up."

At 2027 hours Ofc. Morrison enters the restaurant to get the sober parties that said they would gives Jayson a ride home. When Ofc. Morrison walks back outside Jayson is yelling at the Garfield County Corporal "Fuck you, fuck you, fuck you." At 2028 hours Jayson's ride home comes outside and begins physically pushing him West Bound on the wide walk towards 7<sup>th</sup> St.

After reviewing the body camera and reports of Ofc. Morrison, Jayson was asked no less that 8 times to leave the restaurant not by the working manager but by law enforcement over an approximate 6-minute period. Jayson refused to cooperate with law enforcement while Officers were investigating a crime

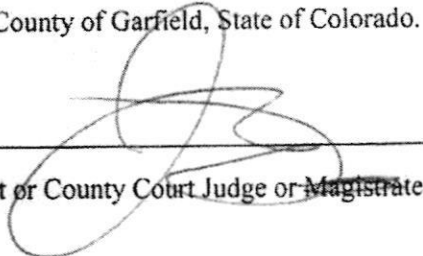
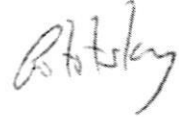

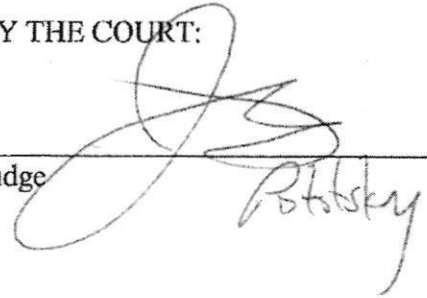

dispatch, it was unknown if Jayson was setting up for an ambush because he knew law enforcement would be responding, which was another reason law enforcement staged.

While I continued to sit at the beginning of the driveway, I attempted to call Tyler. I called the phone number Tyler provided to dispatch utilizing my work issued cell phone. I called Tyler twice, but the calls went straight to voicemail. Afterwards, I requested for dispatch, who was still in contact with Tyler, to ask Tyler if everyone inside the residence would leave and meet us at the beginning of the driveway.

At approximately 0131 hours, I observed that the red light I had earlier observed was moving and it appeared that a vehicle was moving and making its way towards where we, law enforcement, were staged. As the vehicle approached, I observed it was a Ford truck. Once the truck was closer to where we were, I ordered the driver to stop. Once the truck came to a stop, the driver, Geneve Kashnig (DOB: 05-16-1978), was requested to exit the vehicle and talk to us. While Geneve exited the truck, she asked us if we were ok. Geneve advised no one else was in the truck. When Geneve exited the truck, she walked to me, as I stood at the driver side of my marked patrol vehicle.

Geneve advised she was at the residence because she was taking someone home. I advised Geneve why law enforcement was at the residence. Geneve advised she had just dropped Jayson off from a restaurant, Black Bear Bar & Grill. Geneve later clarified that she managed Black Bear Bar & Grill. Geneve had arrived to the residence approximately 20 minutes prior. When I asked Geneve if she had witnessed any sort of altercation between Tyler and Jayson, she said no while shaking her head back and forth, indicating no. When I asked Geneve if Tyler was home, she said Tyler was home and several other people were also home. When I asked Geneve why Tyler would have called us and claimed an altercation occurred, she said she had no idea. Geneve explained that if and/or when people are at the bar after closing, she would offer to drive them home, which was what she did with Jayson.

Once I was done talking with Geneve, I observed another vehicle was approaching us from the driveway. At this point, Geneve was released from the scene.

I observed the vehicle approaching was also a truck. I observed inside the truck was a young male driver, Tyler, and a [REDACTED] in the front passenger seat of the truck. I ordered Tyler to step out of the truck and talk to me where I was. When Tyler approached me, I confirmed everyone from the residence was inside the truck and the only person left at the property was Jayson. Tyler was unsure whether or not Jayson was actually still on the property and believed there was a possibility that Jayson could have left before we arrived. I instructed Tyler to return to the truck he was driving and to relocate at the intersection of Panoramic Drive and County Road 233, for safety reasons.

At this point, considering that Jayson was the only person at the property and he was not a safety concern to anyone else, it was decided that everyone would relocate to the Silt Police Department (SPD). Once I drove away from the driveway, I met with Tyler and requested he meet with me at the SPD.


I followed Tyler to the SPD. Once we all got to the SPD, I gathered Tyler's statement. After speaking with Tyler for quite some time and getting clarification, I was able to gather what happened.

Tyler advised that he was at the residence, lying in bed with [REDACTED] while their [REDACTED] was lying in a laundry basket that was full of clothes. Tyler had determined that the laundry basket was not a hazard for [REDACTED] and it was better for [REDACTED] to sleep in laundry basket, full of clothes, rather than on the bed and risk falling. According to Tyler, at some point, he heard Jayson take [REDACTED] into another part of the house. Tyler was not concerned for [REDACTED] safety, considering Jayson was allowed to be around [REDACTED]. After Jayson took [REDACTED], Jayson returned to the bedroom where Tyler was. Tyler advised Jayson hit his (Tyler's) legs and began to ask him why [REDACTED] was in a laundry basket. Tyler reached for his phone, which was on the bed, and observed that it was approximately 0100 hours and set his phone back down on the bed. Tyler attempted to explain to Jayson that [REDACTED] was fine in the laundry basket. While Jayson continued to question Tyler, Jayson attempted to grab Tyler's phone several times. Tyler advised that because Jayson was under the influence of alcohol, he was clumsy and dropped the phone several times. Tyler believed Jayson was under the influence because he was only clumsy when he drank alcohol and he had slurred speech. Once Jayson was able to grab ahold of Tyler's phone, Jayson threw the phone across some stairs. Tyler got up from bed in attempt to get to his phone. When Tyler got up, Jayson shoved Tyler. Tyler described that Jayson shoved him by placing one hand in the area of his throat/neck and pushing back. Tyler became upset at this point and a physical altercation began between Jayson and him. During the altercation, Tyler advised a female, Geneve, attempted to break up the fight. Tyler stated Jayson pushed Geneve back and away from the fight. Tyler did not believe that it was a hard push when Jayson pushed Geneve. During the physical altercation, Jayson stuck his right hand thumb into Tyler's mouth. While Jayson dug his thumb into Tyler's mouth, Tyler felt that Jayson was going to pull his tooth out. Tyler confirmed this caused him pain. Once the physical altercation between Tyler and Jayson stopped, Tyler was able to get past Jayson and go to where his phone was. When Tyler picked up his phone, he observed the phone was not broken. Tyler showed me his phone and verified that there was no damage. Tyler observed there was white paint on the phone, which he believed was paint from the wall from when the phone hit the wall. Tyler was able to clean off the white paint. Tyler advised that once he had his phone, he called his mom, Lauren Boebert (DOB: 12-19-1986). Lauren told Tyler to call for law enforcement. Tyler stated he was on the phone with Lauren for approximately only one minute and immediately called for law enforcement. Tyler advised that when Jayson saw that Tyler was on the phone with dispatch, Jayson grabbed the rifle. Tyler described the rifle as being black. Tyler stated there was many firearms in the residence and was unable to say what type of rifle it was. Tyler said Jayson did not say anything when he got the rifle. Tyler saw Jayson had the rifle when he was inside the residence but Tyler was not sure if Jayson had taken the rifle outside. Once Jayson was outside, Tyler did not see him again.

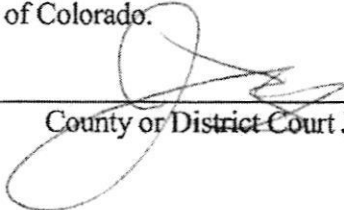
Considering Jayson shoved Tyler, there is probable cause for Harassment. Considering Jayson had caused physical pain to Tyler's mouth when he shoved his thumb into his cheek, there is probable cause to believe Jayson committed assault in the third degree.

Considering Jayson had a firearm in his possession while he was under the influence of alcohol, there is probable cause to believe he committed prohibited use of weapons.

### **INITIAL INFORMATION**

On February 20<sup>th</sup>, 2024, at approximately 06:45 hours, dispatch advised Rifle Police of a trespass that had occurred at [REDACTED]

Roscely Alvarado (DOB 04/24/1995) advised dispatch someone had broken into her parked car at approximately 22:00 hours and took her wallet containing her Alpin Bank Debit Card, Colorado Driver's License, and [REDACTED] social security card.

### **INVESTIGATION**

At approximately 08:33 hours, I Officer A. Herrera, contacted Roscely via phone call. It should be known that Roscely is Spanish speaking, and all our interaction were conducted in Spanish.

I summarized to Roscely what dispatch informed me prior to me calling her. Roscely advised me it sounded correct. I asked Roscely if she knew how much money was stolen on her credit card.

Roscely began telling me the locations the trespasser used her debit card after her car was broken into.

The first place they went was the Kum N Go on the 100 block of East 26<sup>th</sup> street at approximately 23:58 hours.

At approximately 03:31 hours they drove to the Loves gas station in Parachute, Colorado. At 04:55 hours they drove back to the McDonalds on Taughenbaugh Blvd. At approximately 05:55 hours they used the card again at the Kum N Go right next to McDonalds.

Roscely did advise her card was attempted to be used online on Shein.com for a total of \$717.00 but the bank was able to reject the payment and no money was stolen during that attempt. She noticed the attempt at approximately 07:14 hours.

I asked Roscely if she was available to meet in person so I could be able to take photographs of her vehicle and see the transaction on her phone. Roscely advised she was available to meet in person and she was currently working at the Brenden Movie Theater as their cleaner.

I advised Roscely I would be there in five-minutes, and I would call her when I arrive. I also advised her it would be best if while she waits for me, she begins calling her banks and cancels any card she believes could have been stolen.

Roscley stated the bank automatically locked her account and it was all taken care of. I asked her if by any chance, she had cash that could have been stolen. Roscley stated there was no cash but

was very worried because her baby [REDACTED] social security was inside and taken with the wallet.

At approximately 08:47 hours I contacted Roscely outside the Brenden Movie theater, and she was able to show me all the completed and failed transactions. I asked her if she would be okay with me taking pictures of the transactions. Roscely gave me consent to take pictures.

**Below will be the transactions as I read them on Roscely's Alpine Bank app:**

- **Charge on 02/19 23:58 CST at KUM&GO 0922R Rifle, RIFLE, CO on card ending in [REDACTED]**
- **Charge on 02/20 04:24 at LOVE'S #826 Inside, Parachute, Co on card ending in [REDACTED]**
- **Charge for \$26.87 on 02/20 05:48 CST at MCDONALD'S F7316, RIFLE, CO on card ending in [REDACTED]**
- **Charge on 02/20 05:55 CST at KUM&GO 4923R RIFLE, RIFLE, CO on card ending in [REDACTED]**
- **Denied Charge for \$717.00 on 02/20 07:14 CST at SHEIN.COM, 137-2105366, DE. Denied due to card issuer Rejection on card ending in [REDACTED]**

I advised Roscely the actions I would take to moved forward and that a report would be started. Roscely stated she was very worried about her driver's license because it took her very long to get one, to have somebody steal it very easily. I advised her I would do the best I could to find the trespasser and attempt to get her license back.

I asked Roscely where her car was. She asked me to follow her, and I began taking pictures. I did not observe any visible damage or marks of a forced entry inside of her vehicle.

I provided Roscely with my business card that had the incident number on the back. She was advised if she has any more information, to please reach out and give me a call.

I cleared form the scene and began contacting all locations the card was used, starting with Kum & Go on east 26<sup>th</sup> street.

At approximately 09:04 hours I arrived at the east 26<sup>th</sup> street Kum & Go and contacted the manager who was able to find the time and date that the card, ending in the last four digits of [REDACTED] was used.

The manager advised there was nobody in her store at the time of 23:58. She stated she began to go through transactions that were close to that time, because sometimes the time it gives the owner of the card is different from when the transaction got accepted.

She was able to find the transaction with the last four digits ending in [REDACTED] at approximately 22:53 hours. She was correct on the part where the person using the card never walked in the store.

They did use Roscely's card on outside pump #16 and refueled a total of \$81.24 worth of diesel fuel. As I was watching the camera footage, it appeared the trespasser was driving a pickup truck with the body appearance of a Ford F-250.

The manager was available to pull up the receipt and it showed the date, time, pump #, type of fuel, and total amount spent from the card number [REDACTED]. I took pictures of the pickup truck as well as the receipt.

On February 21<sup>st</sup>, 2024 at approximately 08:00 hours I continued with the investigation and contacted Roscely via phone call. I asked Roscely if she knew or could think of any person that would have a motive to go after her directly or knew she left her wallet in her car.

Roscely stated she did not have anybody in mind. She did tell me that on February 20<sup>th</sup>, 2024, at approximately 17:20 hours her card was used again at the Rifle Starbucks, located inside the City Market. The person attempted to use \$10.95 but was rejected.

Shortly after my phone conversation with Roscely, I continued where I left off the day before and called the Parachute, Loves truck stop at approximately 08:09 hours. I advised the employee who I was and what I was working on. I asked her if she or a manager could help me review camera footage, possibly capturing the suspect using Roscely's card.

The employee transferred me over to her manager. I spoke with Brent who was informed of the situation and my reason for the contact. I provided Brent with a date of 02/20/2024, and a time between 04:20 to 04:25 hours.

Brent stated he would be able to review and share camera footage of the times I provided. I also provided him the last four digits of the card, [REDACTED] to narrow down his search. I asked Brent if he could give me a call back on my company provided phone if he receives or finds any information.

At approximately 09:05 hours, I conducted a follow up investigation at McDonalds in attempt to review possible camera footage of when the Roscely's card was used. I spoke with the manager, and I informed her of the case I was investigating.

The manager escorted me to her back office and showed me the angles her indoor cameras capture. She also informed me if my suspect went through the drive through, the camera would

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not have caught a plate or vehicle description because the drive thru only records live for taking orders.

I asked the manager if by chance she would be able to use Roscely's last four card digits to find an exact amount that was purchased from the card. The manager stated she should be able to do that and requested my business card. I provided her all my information with a business card, and she let me know she would email me directly when she is able to locate the transaction.

I cleared from the McDonalds and drove to the Kum & Go next door on Taughenbaugh at approximately 09:24 hours. I asked a store associate if there was a manager I could speak to. The manager called me over behind the register. I informed her of my reasoning for the visit and asked if she would be able to let me review camera footage as well as receive a printed copy of the receipt for the items bought using Roscely's card.

The manger stated she could look up camera footage. She first began by attempting to find when the card was swiped. She stated if she can find the exact time, finding the video footage would be more accurate.

After several minutes of searching, she was eventually able to find the transaction from card ending in [REDACTED]. The card was swiped at 04:55 hours on February 20<sup>th</sup>, 2024. They bought one Cool Blue Gatorade that cost a total of \$3.43. The drink was purchased on cash register #2.

The manager printed me a copy of the receipt for my case. She proceeded to use the time the card was used, and we were able to observe what appeared to be a white female, black hair, black hoodie, black pants, and white shoes approach the cash register at that exact time. Seconds after she approaches the counter, a male can be seen standing directly next to her and waits for her to make her purchase.

He appeared to be a white male, black beanie, blue puffer jacket, and black pants with a white stripe down the side. In the footage it appeared the female used different cards but was not confirmed. She kept on taking the card out of the reader and re inserting it.

At approximately 09:54 hours the manger stated she believes, the female in the video was trying to get cash back out of the card but refused once it asked her to enter the card pin.

The male and female left the store and walked to the south side and got into the same pickup truck that was caught at the Kum & Go on east 26<sup>th</sup> street. The female entered the rear seat on the passenger side and the male sat in the rear seat on the driver side.

The Kum & Go manager was able to pull up the outside, southeast camera that the pickup truck happened to be directly in front of.

Reviewing the camera footage, I was able to confirm the pickup truck was indeed a Ford and it was occupied by four people.

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The pickup truck began backing out of their parking spot and left Kum & Go property at approximately 04:59 hours. The cameras caught the vehicle going north bound towards the Rifle River bridge.

At approximately 11:37 hours, I conducted another follow up at the City Market. I spoke with the general manager, Jason. I informed him of what has happened and that the suspect attempted to use a fraudulent credit card at approximately 17:20 hours on February 20<sup>th</sup>, 2024. I informed him of the last four digits of the card number and the amount that was rejected.

Jason advised me he would reach out to the departments IT personnel and request they go over the footage to attempt and find a description of the suspect. Jason stated he would reach out to my work phone number directly or he would call dispatch for any more information.

Approximately ten minutes after I cleared from City Market, I responded to another vehicle trespass that was reported in the same area. The apartment complex was [REDACTED]. The reporting party was a Molly Rhinaman (DOB 08/11/2005).

Molly stated she went out to her car approximately 10 to 20 minutes before she called 911 to report the trespass. She noticed her driver side door was not closed all the way. She also observed her glove box to be open and all her vehicle documents to be thrown and scattered inside the car.

Molly began looking for her wallet that she left in the glove box the night before. Molly informed me she had an [REDACTED] Visa debit card, her Colorado driver's license and an old gift card from Old Navy that still had \$25.00 on it. She was not able to find it.

I asked Molly if she has observed any transaction that she did not initiate. Molly stated she did. Her card was charged on 02/21/2024 at approximately 01:28 hours for total amount of \$51.19 at the McDonalds in Parachute.

Mollys and her mother called the bank and began locking all her accounts just in case the trespasser attempt to use them again. I asked for Molly's consent to take a picture of the fraudulent transaction. Molly allowed me to take a picture of the charge processed at McDonalds.

I showed Molly and her mom the picture of the Ford pickup and asked if they were able to identify it or knew who could have possibly been driving. Molly stated she did not, and it could be anyone.

Like I told Roscely, if they get any more attempted transaction, please let me know and I will also be in touch with them if I got any new information.

I began taking pictures of Molly's vehicle. I asked Molly if she observed any damage to her door or glove box. Molly state there was no damage. I also did not observe any visible damage. I left

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Molly and her mom with my business card and went to assist my partner with another vehicle trespass that happened about 100 yards west of where Molly's car was parked.

Shaya Lavae Ely (DOB 11/07/1991), owns a red, 2015 Chevy Cruz bearing license plate ECNI27. I learned from my partner's body worn camera that Shaya had her vehicle broken into the night before, 02/21/2024.

The trespasser broke into her glove box and caused damage to the right hinge, making it difficult to close entirely.

You can see me explaining to Shaya that there had been two other people before her that also had their vehicles broken into. Shaya informed me that she had three different cards that were stolen from her vehicle and the first was used on Monday night at approximately 03:20 hours but the card payment was processed at 10:50 hours.

Shaya did some of her own investigation and contacted the Kum & Go on east 26th street. The manager informed her that her mother's card, ending [REDACTED] was processed at approximately 03:29 hours for the purchase of a red bull. Her mom was not able to see the transaction on her personal device since she ordered a new card and was not able to go back through old accounts.

Shaya had her wallet containing \$75.00 in cash stolen, as well as two of her personal Venmo debit cards and her Colorado driver's license.

Shaya was informed by the manager that all the attempted transactions were rejected. Shaya also stated there was nothing in her car that they took that she needed back. Officers took Shaya's report and cleared the scene.

I drove back to the Rifle Police Department to get back in contact with Brent from Love's. I asked Brent if he had had any luck in attempting to find video footage of the person that used Roscely's debit card. Brent advised he was not able to find the footage at the time that I provided for him.

I remembered that both Kum & Go locations in Rifle either had the time frame off by an hour ahead or behind. I asked Brent if he could possibly try finding footage of that card number being used either an hour before or ahead of the time, I provided for him.

Brent stated he would give it a look and he would give me another call back on my work phone if he found anything.

Brent called me back shortly after and told me he had found store recorded video footage of the person that used Roscely's debit card. I asked Brent if it would be okay if I stopped by his store and reviewed the video footage with him. Brent stated it was okay that I came in and I can take pictures and video footage on my phone.

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I advised dispatch I would be conducting a follow up and called myself in route to the Parachute, Love's gas station. I arrived at Love's at approximately 13:06 hours. The Employee behind the counter asked if I was there to see Brent. I advised her I was, and she began to escort me to his office.

Meeting with Brent, he printed a sheet of the transaction that was made when the trespasser used Roscelly's debit card. Reading it from the top, the transaction was made on 02/20/2024, at approximately 03:24 hours.

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While he was checking out, using Roscely's debit card, there was another male on his right, wearing a gray hoodie that read the words "GRIT GLORY" on the front. There were also two females on his left. Their faces cannot be seen, but one appeared to be wearing green and black checkered pants, and a black shirt. The other female was wearing what appeared to be a gray sports bra with pants, showing a black and white design.

When the male was done paying, all four of them began to walk out of the store. When the male in the gray hoodie turned around, the back of the hoodie read "Shooters Grill", with what appeared to look like one revolver on each side of the title and small lettering at the bottom.

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I asked Brent if he had footage that could possibly capture each of their faces. Brent showed me the camera that points directly at the entrance. All four can be seen entering the store.

First, it was the female with the gray sports bra that walked inside, with the female with checkered pants following her. Both females are wearing white shoes. The second female was wearing a black ball hat backwards, and had black, shoulder length hair.

Shortly after the females walked in, the two males entered the store. The male that used Rosceley's debit card held the door open for the one with the gray hoodie. Based off my previous encounters, I was able to identify the male with the gray hoodie to be Tyler Boebert (DOB 03/21/2005).



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Tylers mother, Lauren Boebert, use to be the owner of the Shooters Grill restaurant here in Rifle, Colorado, hence why the gray hoodie would read out "Shooters Grill" on the back. Tyler was also wearing long, black, Under Armor pants.



Tyler and his friends walked around the store and gathered the goods they purchased with Roscelly's debit card. They all walked out and entered the same Ford-F250, that was captured on the Taughenbaugh Kum & Go camera.

Tyler can be seen getting in the driver seat, the female with the backwards hat entered the front passenger seat, the female with the gray shirt and the male with the black beanie got in the passenger side rear seat. They stayed parked for a while before finally reversing out and drove away.

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Using Love's camera, I was able to get a better color description of the Ford-F250. It appeared to have a dark paint, possibly blue or gray.

The Ford-F250 drove away at approximately 05:10 hours.

I cleared of Love's and got in contact with Rifle's school resource Officer, J. Allison. I wanted to know if he was able to identify the other three or has ever contacted them. Officer Allison was not able to identify them but referred me to Rifle High School Principal, K. Michelson.

I conducted a follow-up at Rifle High School where I met with Mr. Michelson. I showed him the picture I took of the male with the black beanie, and red shirt. Mr. Michelson took a good look at the male and was able to provide me a possible name of who it could be.

Mr. Michelson believed it was [REDACTED] I asked him if he knew or has had experience with [REDACTED] Mr. Michelson stated he did not know much of [REDACTED] besides that [REDACTED] used to go to Glenwood Springs High School before being transferred to Rifle High School. Mr. Michelson was not able to contact [REDACTED] very much because [REDACTED] would never show up to school.

I asked Mr. Michelson if he knew a possible address, I could contact [REDACTED] parents. Mr. Michelson provided me with [REDACTED] Colorado.

At approximately 13:48 hours, I made my way over to [REDACTED] to speak with [REDACTED] parents. Neither parent was home, but I was able to leave my business card for them to contact me when they arrive. Approximately 5 minutes after I left, Angela Harding, [REDACTED] stepmom gave me a call back.

I advised her of the case I was working on and asked if by chance I could meet with her later in the day when she is off work. Angela agreed to meet me at her address at 17:00 hours.

While I was waiting for the time to meet with Angela, Dispatch advised Rifle cars of another vehicle trespass that had occurred at the [REDACTED] The reporting party was Cauy Walls (02/27/2001). Cauy was calling in on behalf of his girlfriend, Desirae Danielson (DOB 02/21/2000) who had her car broken into the night before.

Cauy stated he had received an email from the apartment manager, letting tenants know that they had had a lot of break-ins. Cauy noticed someone broke into his girlfriend car earlier that morning and that was when he decided to report it to the police.

Cauy stated all they took was approximately \$2.00 worth of change.

Desirae drives a red 2016, Ford Escape. Cauy was not able to provide vehicle registration to identify the car.

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At approximately 17:32 hours, I was available to meet Angela at her house. Before going forward with any questions, I asked Angela if she had any stepchildren. Angela let me know she has [REDACTED] and one is named [REDACTED]

Angela welcomed me inside her home and let me sit down. Angela began telling me the history of her and her ex-boyfriend Cody Ammond. Cody and Angela had to split up because they both had two [REDACTED] that kept getting themselves into trouble.

Cody was the father of [REDACTED] and Angela was the mother of [REDACTED]. Each parent decided to start focusing on each child individually. Cody and [REDACTED] moved to [REDACTED] while Angela and [REDACTED] stayed at [REDACTED]

At first Angela thought I was there because she was in trouble. I advised Angela she was not in trouble, but her children could potentially be a part of felony crimes that had occurred within the past three days.

I advised Angela that her [REDACTED] could potentially help me identify some of the kids that were involved in the trespasses. Since [REDACTED] I asked Angela if she would be okay if I asked [REDACTED] some questions. [REDACTED] was not being questioned as a suspect)

Angela stated it was okay that I interviewed [REDACTED] and she knows that [REDACTED] has not been part of any crimes since [REDACTED] has been home due to [REDACTED] came out into the living room.

I began asking [REDACTED] what her relationship was with [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated that it was good when they lived together but once [REDACTED] got a [REDACTED] started becoming more distant. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] expressed how [REDACTED] did not like [REDACTED] because [REDACTED] friends have gotten in fight with [REDACTED] friends, and the two groups cannot get along. I asked [REDACTED] if [REDACTED] knew [REDACTED] friend group.

[REDACTED] informed me that [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] are always together, and they hang out with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. I asked [REDACTED] if by chance [REDACTED] could give me a description of [REDACTED] stated [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] did not know much of [REDACTED] other than [REDACTED] had [REDACTED]

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I moved on to asking [REDACTED] about her relationship with Tyler. At first, [REDACTED] gave me a look of confusion by tilting [REDACTED] head a little and squinted [REDACTED] eyes. [REDACTED] then asked me again if I was talking about Tyler Boebert.

I confirmed with [REDACTED] I was talking about Tyler Boebert. [REDACTED] stated [REDACTED] and Tyler were friends over the summer but when [REDACTED] went to Juvi, he got distant and began getting aggressive with [REDACTED] because [REDACTED] dos does not get along with Tyler.

[REDACTED] also knows that [REDACTED] and Tyler had made a sex tape and he sent it to another [REDACTED] in their age group.

[REDACTED] statement with [REDACTED] and Tyler leads me to believe that they do have a possible on-going relationship with one another.

[REDACTED] then began talking about how Tyler almost hit [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] friend with his truck. I repeated what [REDACTED] told me about Tyler almost hitting her with the truck, in the manner that it would raise a question.

[REDACTED] then began explaining what happened during that encounter with Tyler. [REDACTED] said [REDACTED] was in [REDACTED] friend's car while [REDACTED] friend was inside of Tylers truck. arguing. Tyler then began pulling away in his truck and almost hit the car [REDACTED] was in with his truck.

I asked [REDACTED] if [REDACTED] remembered the type of truck Tyler was driving. [REDACTED] believes it was a dodge with a dark blue paint. [REDACTED] also claims it was a big diesel truck. [REDACTED] stated the last time [REDACTED] saw Tyler was when [REDACTED] was still living there, and Tyler was picking [REDACTED] up.

I asked [REDACTED] if I could show [REDACTED] some pictures, [REDACTED] would be able to identify who the people were. [REDACTED] said [REDACTED] would be willing to look.

I first showed [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] was not able to identify anybody. I passed the phone to [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] was quick to point out the male in the gray hoodie reading "Grit and Glory" was Tyler. I asked [REDACTED] how [REDACTED] knew that. [REDACTED] stated [REDACTED] knows his hairstyle, his smile, and [REDACTED] claims [REDACTED] has seen him where the pants he has on in the photo.

[REDACTED] also was quick to point out [REDACTED] [REDACTED] claims the blue puffer jacket that [REDACTED] was wearing the night [REDACTED] used the cards, was the same jacket that [REDACTED] gave him. [REDACTED] also noticed that [REDACTED] has duck feet, which is something [REDACTED] used to make fun of [REDACTED] for.

I showed [REDACTED] the same picture and [REDACTED] claimed it was him. [REDACTED] advised me [REDACTED] recognized the shirt [REDACTED] was wearing because [REDACTED] had washed it several times.

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I moved on to show [REDACTED] the video I took on my work phone, showing the two [REDACTED] as well as [REDACTED] and Tyler walking in the Love's. As I pressed the play button, in an excited tone of voice, [REDACTED] said "oh, that's [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] that Tyler supposedly made a sex tape with. In the video, [REDACTED] Is the [REDACTED] that had the black hair with the backwards ball cap.



[REDACTED] was also able to identify [REDACTED]  
[REDACTED] was the [REDACTED] that first walked in with the gray shirt and designed pants.

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I continued to show [REDACTED] the picture of the truck that was being driven around. I did not tell [REDACTED] what the make or model of truck was but simply asked if the truck looked familiar. [REDACTED] looked at the truck and confirmed it was Tylers truck. I asked [REDACTED] if [REDACTED] was confident in confirming the truck Tyler was driving was a Dodge.

[REDACTED] began questioning [REDACTED] and asked me if it was a Dodge. I did not tell [REDACTED] what the truck was. Towards the end of my conversation with [REDACTED] I asked [REDACTED] if [REDACTED] was 100% confident of the people [REDACTED] identified in the video were Tyler, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] stated [REDACTED] was confident.

I cleared [REDACTED] home at approximately 18:06 hours, and made my way over to [REDACTED] [REDACTED] to meet with Cody. At approximately 18:11 hours, I arrived at Cody's residence and contacted him outside his door.

I confirmed with Cody if he was the father of [REDACTED] Cody stated he was. I asked Cody if I would be available to interview [REDACTED] with him being present. Cody advised me that [REDACTED] was not home and was currently at [REDACTED]

With [REDACTED] not being there, I began explaining the case I was working on with Cody. I advised him right now nobody was in trouble but the charges being pushed are very serious. I asked Cody if he knew the direction or address to [REDACTED] house. Cody did not know from the top of his head but was attempting to pull up a previous contact with [REDACTED] where [REDACTED] sent him the coordinates through Google maps.

Cody was able to show me where [REDACTED] lived. From the coordinates that Cody provided, it showed [REDACTED] was at [REDACTED] Rifle, Colorado. After I received [REDACTED] address, I asked Cody if he had full access into [REDACTED] room. Cody informed me that [REDACTED] does not have a bedroom because he sleeps on a mattress in the living room.

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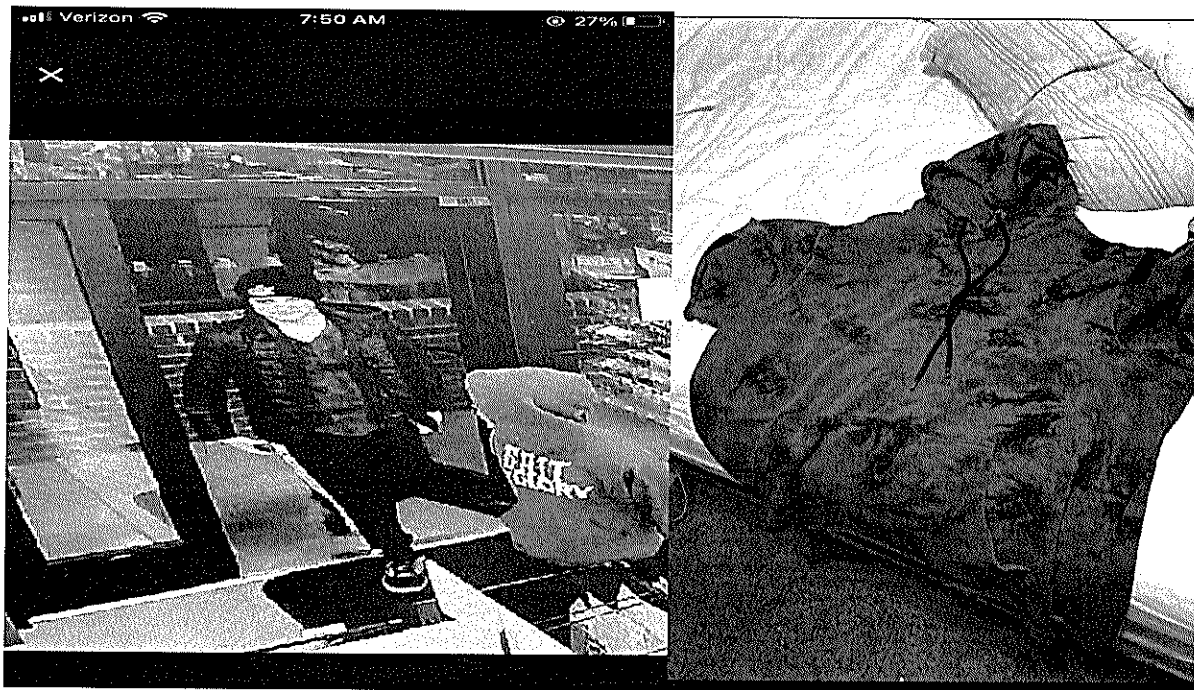
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I asked if he could show me inside and I could possibly recognize some clothing. Cody invited me inside his residence where [REDACTED] bed can be seen on the floor. I showed a picture to Cody of Tyler and [REDACTED]. I asked him if he was able to recognize them. Cody stated he could identify them. But then after watching the video he asked if it was [REDACTED] who walked in the store. I told Cody I did not know.

Cody offered to show me the dirty clothes piled up he had in his own bedroom. I accepted his offer and began digging through the clothes with Cody. Cody pulled out a red shirt that belonged to [REDACTED] and looked to match the one [REDACTED] was wearing when [REDACTED] walked inside the store. Below is the picture I took of Love's video footage and the shirt I found in [REDACTED] dirty clothes pile.



After taking the pictures, Cody and I walked back out to the kitchen area where I asked him if he would be willing to let me speak with [REDACTED] voluntarily, on 02/26/2024. Cody advised me he will have [REDACTED] there and to give him a call the day off to schedule a time.

I left Cody with my name and advised him I would be giving him a follow up phone call the following Monday on 02/26/2024.

On February 26<sup>th</sup>, 2024, at approximately 10:10 hours, I got in contact with Shaya. I wanted to follow up with her and get the exact amount that was stolen from her car. Shaya stated she was

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home, and she would be willing to talk to me in person. She also informed me that whoever stole her driver's license returned it to her through the mail.

Whoever sent it back wrote a letter saying, "Found Loose in Mail". The paper they wrote it on was from Aspen Real Estate Company.

I began making my way over to Shaya's residence. Upon arrival, at approximately 10:17 hours Shaya met me outside and handed the letter. I did observe the letter to have all of Shaya's information but no sender address. I began reading the letter out loud and Shaya stated it was not true that her ID was loose mail because it was in her car.

I continued by asking Shaya if she could refresh my mind on everything that was stolen from her car. Shaya informed me directly that her wallet was stolen.

Inside her wallet she had two Venmo debit cards that had her name listed on them, she had her mother's credit card that had her mom's name listed on it, she had \$75.00 in cash, and last she had her Id that did get taken but returned through mail.

Shaya informed me her glove box was opened and all her papers were scattered around. When it was rummaged through, they broke the right hinge. Shaya stated she wasn't very worried about the damage since she bought the car not in the best condition.

I asked Shaya if I could keep the envelope that her Id was returned in. Shaya told me to keep it and simply wants to find whoever stole her cards and cash.

Shaya expressed she wants the people who did this to her found, because she literally has nothing and everything, she had left to her name was the \$75.00 in cash, and the money left in her card.

Shaya expressed it makes her feel like [REDACTED] Shaya informed me she has a brain tumor and now she does not have the money to get her surgery and she will have to go through the process of getting new cards.

I asked Shaya if she was able to provide proof of attempted or completed transactions since the theft. Shaya advised on her Venmo account, they tried to get cash from her card. She showed me an attempted transaction of \$175.00 at the Kum & Go On east 26<sup>th</sup> street.

Like I said in the beginning, Shaya did her own investigation and spoke with the manager from Kum & Go. The manager advised her she could not find the transaction of \$175.00 but did find a transaction made from her mom's debit card for \$5.00. The \$5.00 purchase was for the red bull I wrote about earlier.

I believe the transaction of \$175.00 probably did not go through, based off a statement the manager from the Taughenbaugh Kum & Go notified me about. She advised me that their Kum & Go system will not be available to find a transaction if the card was rejected.

Shaya did provide me visual proof of the transaction attempted from her card. Shaya was not available to show proof of the transaction made off her mom's card, Tamra Sue Ely (DOB 10/24/1959). I provided Shaya my work phone number and advised her to send me a screenshot of the transaction that was made from her mom's card when she can get in contact with her mom.

At approximately 10:40 hours, Shaya sent me a text message through the number I provided her. The transaction was more than \$5.00 and was \$50.00. the transaction was declined. At the very bottom of the picture, it says it was used on 02/19/2024 at 21:54 hours Pacific Standard Time.

Compared to Mountain Central Time, that means the transaction would have been made on 02/19/2024 22:54 hours, which would line up to the time Roscely's vehicle was also trespassed.

On that same picture it also shows the Kum & go store that the card was used at. It read 'KUM&GO 0922R RIFLE'. I contacted the Kum N Go on 120 East 26<sup>th</sup> Street and asked what their store location was. The employee advised me it use to be 0922 but just recently changed to 5012 because the Kum & Go's are turning into Mavericks.

At approximately 13:18 hours met again with Cody at [REDACTED] Cody invited me into his residence and beside him was [REDACTED]

I Greeted [REDACTED] and advised [REDACTED] of the case I was working. I advised [REDACTED] that as of that moment [REDACTED] was not in any trouble but could potentially help me out with identifying suspects. I did advise [REDACTED] to not be nervous because [REDACTED] was not under arrest or detained. I also informed [REDACTED] had the right to ask me to leave [REDACTED] residence at any time.

[REDACTED] state [REDACTED] would never tell me to leave his house. We sat down and I began making small talk with [REDACTED] On my left, at the head of the dining table sat [REDACTED] directly across from me sat [REDACTED] dad, Cody.

Without me asking any questions, [REDACTED] began telling me he was aware of the situation, and [REDACTED] wanted to be as honest as [REDACTED] could with me. [REDACTED] and I began talking about [REDACTED] personal life and I got to get to know [REDACTED] a little bit more.

Throughout the investigation [REDACTED] informed me [REDACTED] has been trying to get into job core and has been having a difficult time with it. [REDACTED] also stated [REDACTED] has a [REDACTED] that [REDACTED] likes to spend a lot of time with. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] have been together for 2 months.

I was about to get into more detailed question and decide to advise [REDACTED] of his Miranda right at approximately 13:31 hours.

It should be known that [REDACTED] was not detained or placed under arrest. [REDACTED] dad was also there. [REDACTED] was still free to do what [REDACTED] wanted. I asked [REDACTED] what [REDACTED] was

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doing and where [REDACTED] was at the night of the 02/19/2024, into 02/20/2024. [REDACTED] stated [REDACTED] was with [REDACTED] in parachute when they were picked up by another friend.

[REDACTED] claims [REDACTED] did not want to go with the other friend because [REDACTED] simply wanted to be with [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated [REDACTED] felt forced because [REDACTED] wanted to go, and [REDACTED] couldn't leave [REDACTED] behind.

[REDACTED] informed me that [REDACTED] friend did begin trespassing into cars but [REDACTED] stayed back because they did not want to get involved.

[REDACTED] brought up that they all went to the Love's gas station and got snacks. When they were about to check out [REDACTED] stated nobody wanted to use the stolen card and they handed it to [REDACTED] to pay. The card that was used was Roscelly's.

They then left the store and [REDACTED] were dropped back off at [REDACTED] house. I asked [REDACTED] if [REDACTED] was ever in rifle that night. [REDACTED] stated [REDACTED] never went to Rifle and was with [REDACTED] in parachute the entire night.

I asked [REDACTED] if [REDACTED] could possibly help me identify the suspects in the video I recorded from Love's. [REDACTED] said [REDACTED] would give it a look.

I began playing the video and watched it and replayed it quite a few times. Eventually [REDACTED] stated the first [REDACTED] that walked in the store was [REDACTED] and the second [REDACTED] was [REDACTED].

As soon as the video got to the part where Tyler walked and with the other [REDACTED] who from what I learned and [REDACTED] identify to be [REDACTED] got quiet and stated they did not look familiar.

I asked [REDACTED] if [REDACTED] wanted to take a break from reviewing the video, to where [REDACTED] said yes. I put my phone down and advised [REDACTED] of the charges the people in the video are facing. [REDACTED] acknowledged the charges. I asked [REDACTED] if [REDACTED] wanted to review it again. [REDACTED] said yes. I began replaying the video and [REDACTED] mumbled under [REDACTED] breath that it was [REDACTED] that walked in with the red shirt. I asked who the first [REDACTED] with the grit and glory hoodie was. [REDACTED] stated it was Tyler.

I told [REDACTED] was still not under arrest or detained. I advised [REDACTED] I will continue the investigation and [REDACTED] would be hearing from me soon.

On February 27<sup>th</sup>, 2024, at approximately 12:30 hours, I contacted Tyler via phone call. I advised Tyler who I was and that I would like to speak with him regarding a case I was working.

I asked Tyler if he would be willing to meet with me so we can talk and if so if he could come down to the police Department. Tyler stated he would be willing to speak with me, but he did not have a current vehicle and had no way of making it to the Police Department.

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I asked Tyler if it would be okay if I could make meet him at his house. Tyler said it was okay and provided me the address of [REDACTED] I asked Tyler what a good time would be to meet.

Tyler asked if I could come by in an hour, which would be approximately 13:30. I advised Tyler I would be there around 13:30.

At approximately 13:29 hours I contacted Tyler again. I confirmed with him if he was still okay with me coming over to speak with him. Tyler stated it was okay and he would be expecting me.

At approximately 14:15 hours. Myself and a Rifle Police investigator arrived at the address that Tyler provided. Tyler walked out of the house and met me halfway from his house and the driveway.

Tyler requested if we could speak outside. I advised him that was okay. At that point Tyler was under arrest nor being detained. Tyler made the decision to meet with me at his own will. I advised Tyler of his Mirand Rights at approximately 14:18. I did advise him he could exercise his right at any moment throughout our conversation. I made sure he understood his right. Tyler stated he understood his rights. I asked Tyler with his rights in mind if he wanted to still speak with me.

Tyler stated he would still speak with me. I asked Tyler where he was the night of 02/19/2024 through 02/20/2024. Tyler stated he could not remember clearly.

I asked him if he was out with friends. Tyler stated he was with friends and has been hanging out with friends since he just got back from Windsor, where he is currently living.

I asked Tyler with how many friends he was with those nights. Tyler stated he hung out with about 15 friends. Tyler was not able to identify his friends because he claims he simply did not know their names.

I asked Tyler if I gave him a more specific time within those two nights if he would be able to remember better. Tyler stated yes. I provided the time from 22:00 hours on the 19th to 05:00 hours on the 20<sup>th</sup>.

Tyler stated he was home and his friend [REDACTED] asked him to pick [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] up at Deerfield Park. Tyler stated he picked them up and then picked up another friend. I asked if the other friend he picked up was [REDACTED] Tyler stated it was and he picked [REDACTED] up somewhere in north Rifle at a townhouse, by west 24<sup>th</sup> street.

It should be known when I asked Tyler if he knew any of his friend names, he stated he did not but when I brought them up he confirmed they were with him.

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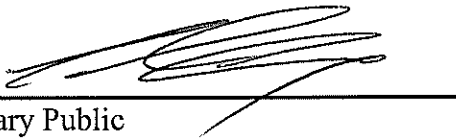

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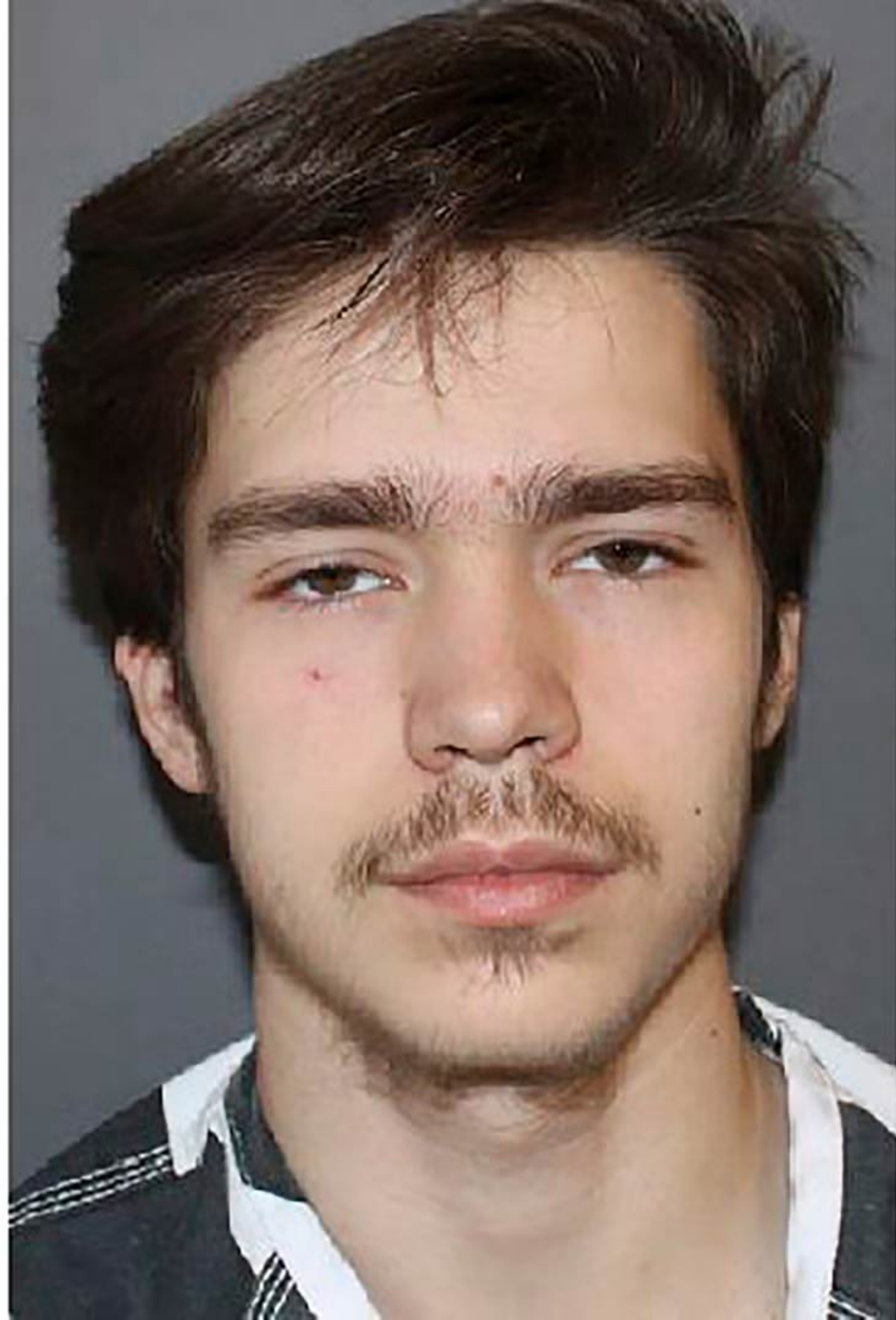
